Tour Description

The Golden Circle is Iceland's most popular route, and it's easy to see why. Located close to the capital, it offers a blend of stunning natural landscapes and rich history, from Iceland's early settlement to modern times.

We start at **Thingvellir National Park**, a UNESCO World Heritage site. This is where Iceland's parliament, the Althingi, was founded in 930 A.D., and where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet, allowing you to walk between two continents.

Our journey continues to the **Geysir Geothermal Area**, a fascinating landscape of bubbling hot springs and steaming vents, where you can witness the powerful eruptions of the Strokkur geyser.

Next, we will visit **Gullfoss Waterfall**, where glacial waters cascade down two magnificent tiers into a rugged canyon. Take a walk along the viewing paths to experience the power and beauty of this iconic natural wonder.

Afterward, we'll stop at **Ingólfsskáli Restaurant** for dinner, where you'll enjoy a delicious Icelandic meal in a cozy Viking-style longhouse. The rustic setting and locally sourced ingredients make this a truly unique dining experience.

Finally, we'll unwind at the **Blue Lagoon**, a geothermal spa famous for its warm, mineral-rich waters. Relax and rejuvenate in this otherworldly setting, surrounded by the stunning volcanic landscape—a perfect way to finish the day and reflect on your Icelandic adventure.

Thingvellir(Þingvellir) National Park

Thingvellir (Þingvellir) National Park is one of Iceland's most outstanding geological wonders. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a filming location for Game of Thrones. Explore this epic Icelandic landscape, where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet! Þingvellir means "assembly fields," and in the year 930 AD, Iceland's historic democratic parliament—one of the first in the world—was founded there. Most Icelandic people regard Þingvellir as a sacred place, a place of great beauty, and an incredible stepping stone in their history.

Around the year 1000 AD, the great Law Speaker, Þorgeir Ljósvetningagoði Þorkelsson, declared Iceland's peaceful conversion to Christianity right here at Þingvellir. A unique compromise was reached that made Christianity the official religion of Iceland while allowing pagans to worship the Norse Gods in private. This prevented a violent civil conflict without shedding a drop of blood.

The geological processes that shaped the land at Þingvellir National Park are as remarkable as the significant historical events that took place there. Since 2004, Þingvellir has been listed on UNESCO's World Heritage List for its geological uniqueness and historical significance.

In Game of Thrones, Thingvellir appears as the narrow path leading to the Eyrie, the location of Arya and Sandor Clegane's journey, and as the site where Brienne and the Hound engage in a bloody battle in the 4th season.

Geysir

The English word "geyser" is derived from the Icelandic word "geysir," which means gusher. Though the Great Geysir itself is now more or less inactive, the surrounding area is geothermally very active, with many smaller hot springs. The main attraction is now Strokkur (The Churn), another geyser located 100 meters south of the Great Geysir, which erupts at regular intervals of about 10 minutes. Its white column of boiling water can reach heights of up to 30 meters. The whole area is a geothermal park situated on top of a vast boiling cauldron. Belching sulphurous mud pots of unusual colors, hissing steam vents, hot and cold springs, warm streams, and primitive plants can all be found here. A short distance to the west stands the small Laugarfjall Mountain, offering a panoramic view of the Geysir area.

Gullfoss Waterfall

Gullfoss, also known as the Golden Waterfall, is one of the most popular tourist attractions in Iceland. It is located on the Hvítá (White) River, which is fed by Iceland's second-largest glacier, Langjökull. The water cascades down two steps, one 11 meters high and the other 22 meters, into the rugged canyon below. This canyon was created at the end of the Ice Age by catastrophic flood waves and is lengthened by 25 cm a year due to constant erosion. As one first approaches the falls, the edge is obscured from view, making it appear as if the river simply vanishes into the earth. Gullfoss and its environs were designated as a nature reserve in 1979.

Know More About Blue Lagoon

Visiting the Blue Lagoon is on many people's bucket lists for a good reason.

The **<u>Blue Lagoon</u>** is one of Iceland's most popular tourist destinations, famed worldwide for its stunning setting in a vast black lava field and the therapeutic properties of its mineral-rich waters.

Geologically, the Blue Lagoon is unique as it is an artificial feature, created from the water discharged by the Svartsengi geothermal power plant. The mineral-rich hot water, not directly used for bathing, is first used for heating; excess water is then released into the surrounding lava fields, where it forms the Blue Lagoon.

The water cools during this process and by the time it reaches the bathing area, it has cooled to a comfortable temperature for soaking. The Svartsengi lava fields, geologically young and formed during a volcanic eruption in 1226, are highly porous, allowing water to seep through rapidly. As the water cools, sulfur transforms into silica sludge, forming the soft mud in the lagoon. This silica is also a primary ingredient in the skincare products developed at the Blue Lagoon.
